Uniform Policy

We have a school uniform that all pupils are expected to wear. Parents are made fully aware of this policy upon entry to our school and signing of our Home-School Agreement confirms this. The adherence to this policy is in the ethos of our school to create a well ordered society in which all children can thrive.

Winter

Yellow polo-shirt
Grey trousers or skirts
Green school sweatshirt or cardigan (purple in Y6)
Grey or black tights
Socks should be white, grey or black

Summer - as winter plus

Green or yellow gingham dress (purple in Y6)
Grey short or long trousers

Shoes

Black sensible shoes or sandals (low heels)
No trainers or boots.

Art shirts - can be sent into school to help protect your children's clothing during Art activities

PE and Games

For health and safety reasons all children must be correctly dressed for PE and Games.

Indoor Lessons

PE Bag
Pumps (not trainers)
Green shorts
White school P.E. T-shirt

Outdoor Lessons

As indoor plus a tracksuit in cold weather

Swimming

Costume
Towel
Swimming hat
Bag for above to be carried in.

Many of the uniform items are available from the school office. **Please clearly mark your children's belongings with their name.**

Reading Pack

Green reading pack with logo for carrying all necessary equipment - books, homework, letters etc.

Bags

We ask that children do not bring large sports bags or rucksacks into school as we do not have the space to accommodate them safely.

Drawstring backpack bags are an ideal size for school. We sell Reading Bags and PE Bags in school colours.

Personal belongings

Children wearing watches must remove them before PE and games and swimming and the school cannot accept responsibility for any personal belongings of this nature.

The following items should not be worn for school:

- Jeans
- Nail Varnish
- Jewellery
- Make-up

The following items should not be brought to school:

- Sweets/chewing gum
- Toys/games
- Money (unless for tuck/payments)

Hair

We ask that parents do not allow children to have their hair coloured, shaved too short or gelled into extreme styles. Headscarves can be worn for religious purposes, these should be a plain colour in line with school uniform.

School Policy on Mobile Phones in school

We do not allow pupils to have mobile phones whilst in the school building, playground or whilst on school trips or our activity week.

If mobile phones are brought into school they must be handed in at the school office where they will be kept until school closes, at which time they can be collected.
