- ▶ Take on responsibilities such as Pupil Leaders, School Council, Eco Reps, School Magazine and Play Leaders.

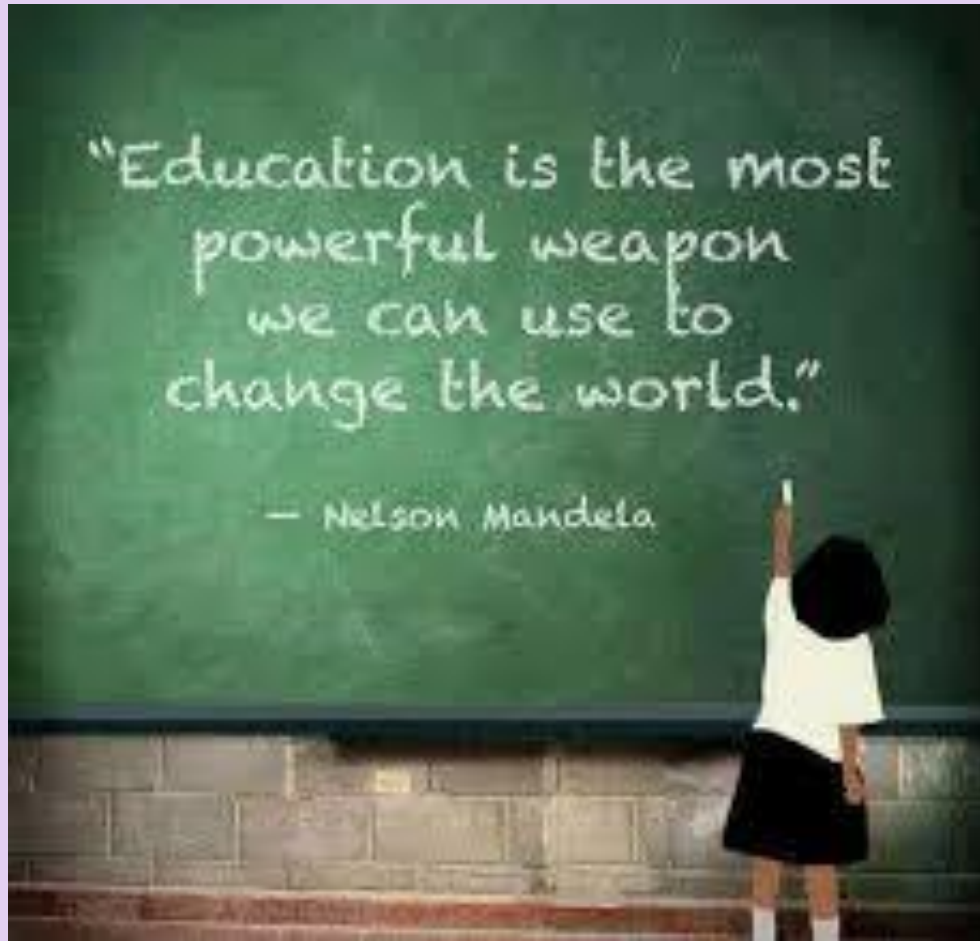
# Opportunities for our Children:
